This layout not only reflects the team's commitment to environmental considerations but also ensures a hygienic and clean working environment on the site. Remarkably, the team has demonstrated effective project management by aligning activities with the established schedule.

Construction Progress



The boys' hostels having reached 100% plinth beam completion stage, statutory approvals in the form of partial completion certificate (CC) from Bombay Municipal corporation for H7 and H8 obtained, and work above the substructure level started for the boy's hostels.



For Hostel 21, 76% work has been completed and is in full swing to get it up to the plinth level.



On Material procurement we have obtained 607.4 M.Ton of Steel and 4874.5 m3 of cement as on date as necessary for the construction.




As per new BMC guidelines, we will be installing a 25 ft safety barricading surrounding the entire hostel site with a digital Air Quality index.



All other continuing activities such as Dust Management, Noise control measures, Welfare facilities, Housekeeping & Road cleaning, Emergency & Security Management and lastly the Tree Protection persist as before with same diligence.


